CHAMBER MUSIC CONCERT I

Baroque Beginnings: Highlights from Giulio Caccini's *Nuove Musiche* (1602)

Harmonia Stellarum Houston: Michael Skarke, *altus* Mario Aschauer, *harpsichord*

The invention of monody, a single voice accompanied by a chordal instrument, constitutes the quantum jump from the polyphonic Renaissance to the emotionally charged Baroque period. The new aesthetic of a dramatically charged solo voice paved the way for the development of opera. One of the spearheads of this musical revolution was Italian singer and composer Giulio Caccini, who not only contributed music to the first operas of music history but also published perhaps the most influential collection of monodies: his Nuove Musiche ("New Musics") of 1602. Our program features the highlights from this collection: love poetry by some of the most renowned Italian poets of his time—Guarini, Strozzi and Rinuccini—with the sweet melodies and lush harmonies of opera's first star.

Il Pastor Fido

Sunday, November 19 at 5 pm

First published in 1590, Guarini's pastoral tragicomedy was not only a highly popular literary work. It also became a primary source of texts for composers of madrigals and monodies throughout the late Renaissance and early Baroque periods. Featuring complex webs of love affairs and a vivid mythological-pastoral setting, the poem inspired some of the most harmonically adventurous and dramatic musical settings of the period, including Caccini's famous *Amirilli, mia bella*. The program will also feature works by Monteverdi, Rossi, Marenzio and others.

Alessandro Scarlatti: Il Primo Omicidio

Sunday, May 26 at 5 pm

Tesserae presents Alessandro Scarlatti's monumental late oratorio, a Baroque masterpiece rarely heard in Southern California. Featuring an all-star cast of characters (including Lucifer himself!), the work depicts the biblical tale of Cain and Abel with the absolute high drama that can be provided only by the Roman Baroque theatrical style and Scarlatti's intense harmonic language. A continuation of Tesserae's Roman concert (2021-2022 season), this concert will be performed at historic Roman pitch (which was around $A\!=\!392$). It will also feature short selections by Scarlatti's fellow Roman composers Corelli and Bernardo Pasquini.



Fauré & Brahms

Commemorating the Fauré Centennial All Saints' Choir & Orchestra

Gabriel Fauré, Requiem, Op. 48 Johannes Brahms, Vier Gesänge, Op.17 Craig Phillips, Homage to Fauré (premiere)

2024 marks the centennial of the death of French composer Gabriel Fauré, and we commemorate the occasion with a performance of his glorious Requiem. Fauré composed the work between 1887 and 1890, with the initial impetus possibly being the death of his father –



though he claimed that it was not written for any particular reason. Shorter than many settings of the Requiem, its final version consists of seven movements for soprano and baritone soloists with mixed choir, orchestra and organ. The work conveys an overall sense of peace, and Fauré said of the work "Everything I managed to entertain by way of religious illusion I put into my Requiem, which moreover is dominated from beginning to end by a very human feeling of faith in eternal rest."

The Requiem is paired in this performance with Brahms' Vier Gesänge (Four Songs), scored for women's voices, two horns and harp. The concert also includes the premiere of a new work by Craig Phillips, *Homage to Fauré*, scored for men's voices, solo violin and strings.
