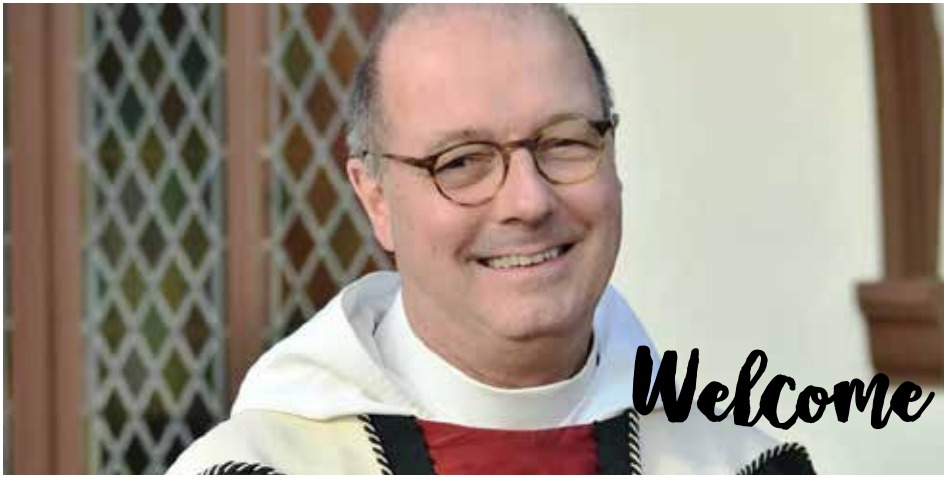

Fifty-nine people killed, 527 others wounded in just nine minutes of rapid fire assault. It sounds like a battlefield report, reminding us about the horrors of war. But no, here in the United States, this is just a somewhat regular news report from one of our cities, this time from Las Vegas, not long ago from San Bernardino, Orlando, a grammar school in Connecticut where a classroom of five-year olds were slaughtered, a high school and then a movie theatre in Colorado....

We live in an increasingly uncertain world, yet this simply doesn't happen anywhere—at least in what is referred to as “the developed world”—except in the United States of America. Of course, we have a ritual for how to follow up with these regular news stories. The president offers words of condolence, flags are lowered to half mast, prayers are offered, politicians take to the talk shows and the pundits weigh in on how terrible it is, and most of us feel genuinely horrible about what has happened. Yet we quickly go back to business as usual with no moral resolve to make this the last time, and instead we wait until the next time. Our political leaders assess it's too “political” to deal with, lest they put their jobs in jeopardy. Yet it is not a political issue, it is a moral and public health issue.

After Sandy Hook, some people thought that we Americans, so many of us who call ourselves followers of Jesus, surely would have demanded something be done to try and stop this carnage from happening again, but it turned out to be a naïve notion because there just wasn't any collective resolve for such a sustained effort.

My friends, there is simply no reason why any civilian needs to own an assault weapon; they are weapons of war. As we know by now, the madman responsible for this latest round of death and injury owned 47 firearms, 12 of which he legally converted into rapid fire weapons, and all of which were purchased legally. This is a definition of lunacy and grave public moral failing.

As professing Christians, will we commit this day to a course of conversation, education, advocacy, witness and action that courageously contributes to shaping a common life that affirms the dignity of every human being and protection of life as ultimate values?

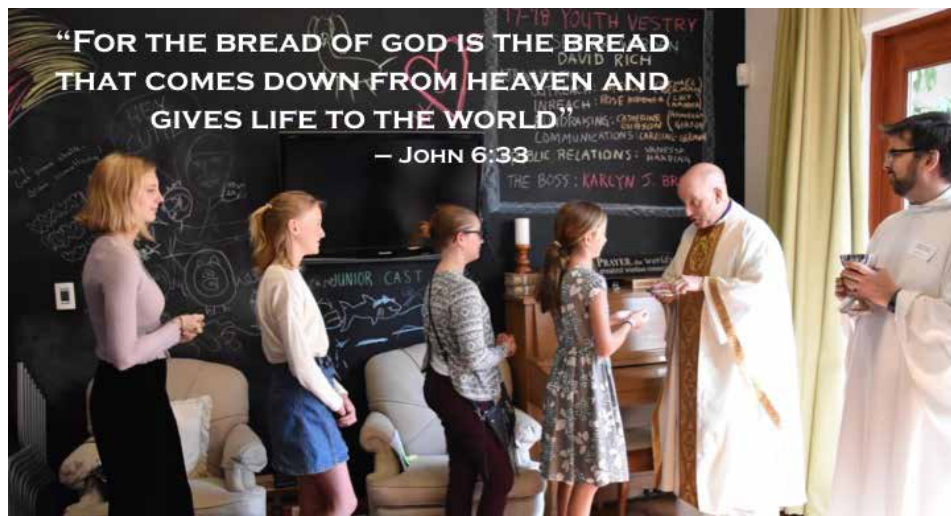
